In addition to SLL, the Swedish Association of Local Authorities and Regions (SALAR), Inera, and Region Gotland can also use HiQ as a supplier within the agreement.

We look forward to continue contributing through the new agreement, and simplify for both patients and healthcare providers,” says Peter Lager at HiQ.
